AS A FRONTLINE WORKER, YOU WILL SOON QUALIFY FOR AN OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE A VACCINE

1: IT'S SAFE



Even under emergency conditions, the FDA will only approve vaccines for release when they have data proving their safety and showing the vaccine meets or exceeds minimum efficacy thresholds.

2: IT'S EFFECTIVE



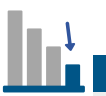
It's the most effective way to prevent getting COVID-19. Even if you get the disease, these vaccines will help prevent serious illness.

3: IT'S FREE



Providers must vaccinate people regardless of their ability to pay. Providers may be able to charge an office visit fee, or administration fee, though this fee can usually be billed to insurance or Medicare/Medicaid.

4: MINIMAL SIDE EFFECTS



Millions of Americans have received the vaccine. Patients in clinical trials and those in the general public have shown few side effects. Soreness at the injection site, fever, and body aches are the most common side effects.
