12:25 – 12:45 PM	Courtney Boyce: Central District Health is pursuing a behavioral health HRSA grant opportunity to address substance use prevention and substance use disorders for teens and adolescents. CDH would like to write in Elmore County agencies to receive this funding. Some activities that were brainstormed to

be supported by this grant opportunity are: peer recovery, support, certifications and trainings and supervision for staff offering those services; mobile mental health services; peer recovery and recovery oriented spaces; facilitation of a resource center; etc. If you think your agency could be supported by this effort and would be willing to write a letter of support for the grant application please reach out to Mindy (mcurran@dh.idaho.gov) or Courtney Boyce (cboyce@cdh.idaho.gov).
