Using your first/last name and Medicaid ID number, request a prescription at any pharmacy with Naloxone. The pharmacist will write you a prescription for Naloxone.

There is no limit on the number of prescriptions you can receive in Idaho. Naloxone may be free or cost a small copay depending on your insurance.
