	In response to the recent youth death by suicide in Mountain Home, St. Lukes has released and has been sharing 2 different resources related to suicide postvention recommendations: Core Response Strategies and Event Planning Considerations. Vicky also proposed the coalition and/or especially the mental health committee look into scheduling a deeper dive of these resources with the St. Luke's Behavioral Health clinicians.
	Vicky also shared a history of the Yellow Buddy Bench Story, and then that St. Lukes is working with in the Mental Health Subcommittee and community partners to reinvigorate the Yellow

Bench Story and had a yellow bench at their You Are More festival event booth and it was a success!

Travis mentioned that the VA is partnering with St.Lukes to distribute 10,000 gun locks for community members in need within their emergency departments within their footprint.
