## Old Business & Updates from the Summer

- Horseshoe Bend Summer Food Program (Kelsey)


- They increased the number of families who they have gotten food into homes for by 400% this summer! It was good work, but really hard. They are going to make some changes to how they will be dividing up food for families vs individuals for the program next summer.

- Provided 32 seniors in the community with 4 meals a week! Really sad when they had to tell them it was over. The seniors loved to come in and interact with students helping out. Working on grants and funding options to restart that in the summer.

- Monday Nights "We Eat Together" meals will be served to anyone in the community for a FREE meal. Location also serving as a warm place for those who might need it.



- Cooking Matters for Teens starts on October 29<sup>th</sup> in Horseshoe Bend! See flyer attached to email for more information. Class is for middle-high school students. We will try to get any future Cooking Matters classes into the Community Ed catalog.



- SWIAA Visit to GV Senior Center (Mindy)

- Southwest Idaho Area Agency on Aging and CDH visited the GV Senior Center, and gave some health related goodies and resources to those senior centers. We would like to set up similar visits to Basin Senior Center and the HSB Senior Center. Mindy can work with senior center contacts to coordinate this.

- Idaho City LEAP Housing Meeting & Follow Up (Mindy)

- We had a great turnout at the Idaho City LEAP Housing meeting that happened at the Idaho City School in the summer. Bart Cochran came to present about LEAP and talk about opportunities that LEAP can help with to create affordable housing in Idaho City. Bart and Mindy will be presenting about LEAP to the Idaho City City Council on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Agenda will be posted closer to that date, and as far as I know, the meetings are open for people to attend, and there is a Zoom option. Bart will give a similar presentation for city council to start the conversation about affordable housing possibilities in Idaho City.

- Mobile Prescription/Pharmacy Opportunities (Mindy)

- Garden Valley is the only pharmacy in Boise County and we are working to get more medical and dental providers into Boise County or more accessible to Boise County residents. Mindy connected with Mountain Care Pharmacy, and independent pharmacy located out of Boise, to chat about making their services accessible to Boise County residents. They are able to bill insurances, including Medicaid, and are able to handle any prescriptions that a retail pharmacy will fill. They can ship prescriptions directly to patients (possible extra cost), OR make weekly deliveries to a "clinic" whom has their dispensing license. To get a dispensing license is a \$100 cost. Mindy will follow up and see if there are other stipulations for a clinic to get a dispensing license.

Some questions that came up were:

• Are there some medications that cannot be shipped? That has been a barrier for folks in the past.

Mindy will continue this conversation with the Idaho City coalition members and R4JJC to see if funding from the council could be used for this type of activity, perhaps next summer</li> </ul> |
