Committee Updates:Nutrition, Nicotine/SUD, Mental Health

Mental Health Committee (Ali Shields)

Mental Health Committee met in January and has been working on updating their action plan activities. The next meeting in March, was going to be in-person, but was decided to be virtual, and will be happening on March 11th from 2:30-3:30pm. There are mental health trainings offered through Empowered Idaho, which Ali will work on finding out more about. Vicky mentioned she is working with the person who coordinated the Spanish QPR training in Meridian to bring it to Mountain Home, more info to come on that. Idaho Resilience Project is disbanding in July, and is offering free mental health and resilience trainings to interested community organizations. If any Elmore County organizations would like to bring one of these trainings to their staff or members, the flyer is attached in the minutes email titled Trauma and Resilience Informed Community-Based Trainings.

Nutrition Committee (Mindy Curran)

Current plans for nutrition committee activities are: continue to promote food pantry promotion with Elmore County specific food locator cards, work on food rescue efforts, nutrition education focusing on athletes and senior populations specifically.

Suicide Prevention Trainings Presentation (Connor Young)- See 21:40- 28:30 in recording

Connor young is the Suicide Prevention Coordinator for CDH, and can offer free suicide prevention trainings. Please see the following offerings, and reach out to him if you have any questions:

The following trainings are offered virtually or in person and can be hosted at CDH or at your location:

- Question, Persuade & Refer (QPR) is for groups or individuals interested in learning more about how to identify suicide warning signs, ask the question, and refer suicidal individuals to help.
- Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed for adults who regularly interact with youth. The course covers common youth mental health challenges. typical adolescent development, and a 5-step action plan for helping young people in crisis and non-crisis situations.

- LivingWorks Faith is a self-paced, online training for Christian Faith Leaders that helps increase knowledge on keeping individuals safe from suicide and ministering to those who have experienced suicide loss.
- **Mental Health First Aid** teaches people how to recognize mental health or substance misuse challenges in adults ages 18 and older, how to offer and provide initial help, and how to guide a person toward appropriate care if necessary.
- Adolescent Mental Health 101 is designed to give caregivers and school staff a better understanding of mental health and brain development by learning how to communicate with adolescents, differentiate between typical behavior and potential mental health challenges, and seek mental healthcare.
- LivingWorks Start is a self-paced, online course that teaches individuals to recognize when someone is thinking about suicide and how to connect them to professional and community support.

Connor also recently received a NACCHO grant, in partnership with Travis at the Boise VA, and Idaho BackCountry Veterans to provide outdoor mental health excursions for veteran and military affiliated people. Connor is working on getting the contract in place, and excursions scheduled. We will promote this more once excursions are scheduled.
